According to the National Reading Panel (2000), explicit instruction of vocabulary is highly effective. To develop vocabulary intentionally, students should be explicitly taught both specific words and word-learning strategies. To deepen students' knowledge of word meanings, specific word instruction should be robust (Beck et al., 2002).

Indirect instruction also includes helping students develop an appreciation for words and experience enjoyment and satisfaction in their use (Baumann, Kame'enui & Ash, 2003).

Use tools to help students track text. Colored overlays and reading guide strips are both tools that can help struggling readers. Colored overlays are helpful for some students who struggle. If students perceive the words to be moving on the paper, a colored overlay can help reduce this issue.

Instead, introduce the words to kids in photos or in context with things they know and are interested in. Use analogies and metaphors, and invite students to create a symbol or ...

Students who struggle to acquire new vocabulary may have generalized linguistic deficiencies, memory deficits, poor word learning strategies, or any combination of the three (Baker, Simmons, & Kameenui, 1995). These students typically require more explicit instruction and intensive practice in order to master key vocabulary.
